







KS1 and KS2: What will school be like when we go back?

You might not be with your usual teacher, but whoever you are with will be very glad to see you and will look after you.



We will be working in small groups all of the time so that we have more space around us.



School will have a one-way system in the corridors so that we don't bump into other groups.



Our classrooms will be set up differently. There will be fewer tables and these will be spread out so that we can sit 2m apart. We will have a table each.



We will have our own pack of resources so that we don't have to share them.



We will eat our lunch and play in our small groups. We might not see all of our friends, but will be able to have fun in our group.



We can wear PE kit with trainers or comfy shoes and a school jumper or cardigan to school. This will mean that we don't need to get changed in school. It is important to change our clothes when we get home.



We don't need to bring anything other than a lunch box (if we need one) to school.



If you have a cough, high temperature or lose your sense of smell or taste, you still need to self-isolate. Do not come into school if you are poorly.
